


## Make Your Own Cowboy Gear


Chaps - Materials: butcher paper / yarn / scissors / crayons

- 1. Measure the student's legs. Cut a piece of white or brown butcher paper that length.
- 2. Cut the butcher paper into two strips: 1 foot wide
- 3. Fold the top of the each strip over two inches and staple.
- 4. Students run yarn through the top fold to make a belt.
- 5. Students cut slits for fringe.
- 6. Students can decorate chaps with pictures of brands, horses, stitches, etc



Vest - Materials: brown paper bags / scissors / crayons 1. Open the paper bag and cut all the way down the front.

- 2. Cut a neck hole in the bottom of the bag.
- 3. Cut two arm holes on each side of the bag.
- 4. Students cut slits along the bottom to make fringe.
- 5. Students decorate the vests with crayon pictures.



Spurs - Materials: brown and gray construction paper / scissors / star stencil / glue / silver glitter / paper clips

- 1. Cut 18 x 1 1/2 inch strips of brown construction paper. (2 /child)
- 2. Students use the star stencil to trace two gray stars and glue them onto the brown strips.
- 3. Students add silver glitter to their stars.
- 4. Use paper clips to secure the spurs onto the students ankles.



Bandana - Materials: fabric / pinking shears / crayons

- 1. Use pinking shears to cut large triangles out of fabric.
- 2. Students decorate the fabric with crayon drawings.
